Health Systems, Services and Policy Concentration Competencies

After completion of this concentration, the graduate should be able to:

- Describe and apply appropriate theory and research approaches and methods to the analysis of health systems, public health and health care services and programs, and governmental and non-governmental policies.
- 2. Identify key social actors/stakeholders and the roles they play in national and international health systems, and public health and health care services and programs and in developing national governmental and non-governmental policies.
- 3. Identify the most important problems affecting international and national health systems, and public health and health care services and programs, and policies.
- 4. Use public health data including as vital statistics, hospital discharge data, health care quality and expenditure data, disease registries, census data, national surveys, and other surveillance data.
- 5. Integrate qualitative and qualitative methods, and policy analyses in the critical evaluation of public health literature related to public health systems, services and policies.
